Your contributions have been instrumental in enabling us to provide quality educational programming, preserve history, and engage with our community. As a result, in 2025 we were FULLY BOOKED, and 2026 is likely to repeat.

That's over 6,000 students who will experience programs that foster a love of local history that will last a lifetime.

For the last 4 years, we have used \$7,000 of grant funding to provide significant discounts for field trips with over 100 participants, title 1 schools, as well as supply extra interpretive materials for those field trips. It's been an incredible community driven initiative and has allowed us to focus on education and student engagement.


Our Students and Programs
